Career Transition Partnership

The Ministry of Defence (MOD) and careers specialists Right Management Ltd formed the <u>Career Transition Partnership</u> (CTP) to provide resettlement services for those leaving the armed forces, regardless of time served.



CTP provides flexible support from two years **before** discharge, through to two years **after**. They aim to give you all the tools needed to market yourself confidently to employers and to get the most out of life outside the forces. **CTP** connects veterans with jobs, employment fairs, courses and training programmes.

There is now a <u>Veterans' Gateway App</u> which you can use to find support organisations in your area using a smartphone or tablet.

<u>Service for Experienced, Rejoiner and Volunteer Engagements</u> (SERVE) is a free and easy to use website. It can be used by all regular and reserve service personnel, Veterans; and anyone interested in staying connected with defence.

SERVE advertises Reserve, re-joiner and wider opportunities across all 3 services, including joint organisations, in one place. It is available through any internet-connected device such as a mobile, desktop or tablet.

Regular Forces Employment Agency (RFEA) provides service leavers and veterans. with specialist careers information, advice and support to access job and training opportunities. The RFEA works with a number of partners and is supported by a number of national military charities.

ExForces Jobs Network is a joint venture with the **British Forces Broadcasting Service** (BFBS) – the UK's only media organisation dedicated to Britain's armed forces and veterans – which also includes BFBS TV and BFBS Radio. This site is run by ExForces Information Services in conjunction with Forces Network.
